Learning is a never ending process. We teachers come across a wide spectrum of young minds and hearts. They are in our hands to make or mar, to evoke dreams or shatter hopes, for their potential is boundless.

An inspiring orientation was held for teachers on 2nd July, 2012 organised by Ratna Sagar Publications. The resource person was Ms Avneet Kaur who conducted the workshop on how teachers should deal with students in class. She commenced the session by asking what challenges are faced by children in the class. The teachers came up with many which were categorized into four groups. Ms. Kaur gave us a questionnaire in which we had to show our preferred response style. At the end of the exercise it was apparent that majority use the advising response. She explained the importance of the other response styles which will surely

help the teachers to deal with behavioural problems that occur in the classrooms. She

stressed on the fact that it is essential to adopt the strategies of prevention and early intervention to help the students strengthen their weaknesses.

The orientation ended with a touching power point presentation which showed how a teacher can make a difference in a child's life. Certain points were highlighted as they would benefit in the psychological development of a child. An example of THE ICEBERG was given. Just as we see only the tip of it and cannot fathom its depth, so also in the class we see a small percentage of the child's problems. We should delve and probe deeper to search, find and understand the root of their problem and thus help the child to find an emotional balance. Another thing that was stressed upon was to be aware of a Child's Rights and uphold them. This would help us to be a democratic teacher.

We are thankful to Sr. Evelyn for giving us the opportunity to attend such an enlightening and interesting workshop.

poem and I struggled to remain in breath and in given time.



On 4th August 2012, the science students of class 11 and 12 attended a counselling session held by Dr. Anjali Bajpai, a post doctoral researcher at IIT Kanpur. She completed her schooling from our very own institution. At present, she is one of the lead scientist at IIT Kanpur and the Nottingham University project.

management, Bio-engineering and a few others. All these courses are available in India and have firm establishments and guaranteed placement opportunities. There is a lot of scope for success, individually and otherwise. Due to such new course versions the clichéd ideas have been put to an end. Now a mathematician and a biologist, or a physicist and a biologist or a computer specialist and a biologist can work together as a team on the same project. She urged us that research work should be a primary career choice and not kept as an alternative. 




Q1. Should there be "complete" freedom?




Q2. Which of two is better?




Q3. What do students go online for the maximum?




Q4. Should 'gadgets' especially 'Mobile' be allowed in schools?

right and fight all our fears with dignity. She was a scrupulous teacher who was always successful in bringing out the hidden talent in us. She made us realize how important we are for this society.



When I joined St. Mary's Convent as a teacher, I was fortunate to meet her as a colleague and know more about her. In the year 2009, we shared the joyous moments of Sister's completion of 50 Golden years in religious life. The occasion included a beautiful programme conducted by the students and the next day Mass followed by lunch. It was true celebration when Sister had her own family around her but she made us feel one with them and was able to share equal attention with all. Till June this year we saw Sister active. On 31st August 2012, we heard about her illness and that she was admitted in Nazareth Hospital, Allahabad. We all included her in our prayers and kept her in our hearts - but the time took its toll. Death leaves a heartache that no one can heal, but Sister will live in our hearts forever because "Death ends a life not a relationship."
